MIGRATION IN ITALY

Italy was a country of large-scale emigration up until the early 1970s

The problem of security related to irregularity led center-right and center-left governments to pass two laws, Turco-Napolitano and Bossi-Fini, to reduce the flow of irregular immigrants.

In the end of 2019, the implementation of the NATIONAL INTEGRATION PLAN was carried out in three regions, Piemonte, Emilia Romagna and Calabria, with the collaboration of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) which co-drafted the plan.

MIGRATION POLICY

DECREE "SICUREZZA E IMMIGRAZIONE" (2018) TWO CONSEGUENCES

1) The decree abolished humanitarian protection: a form of residual protection that could be offered to those who did not receive refugee status or subsidiary protection but at the same time could not be removed from Italy for objective reasons.

REPLACEMENT with so-called "special" protection: a residence permit for cases considered special, of serious illness, contingencies of exceptional calamity or acts of special civic value.



2) The "Protection System for Asylum Seekers and Refugees" (Sprar) is changed to "Protection System for Holders of International Protection and Unaccompanied Foreign Minors" (Siproimi): the system excluded asylum seekers from the centers.

MIGRATION POLICY

In terms of migration policy, there are likely increasing conflict over migration between the EU and the party leader of the Brothers of Italy, Giorgia Meloni, who has recently become Italy's new prime minister.
